Temperature preference: 70f or 21c (if you're comfortable in your home it's probably comfortable for your violet) not below 60f or 16c or higher than 80f or 27c. Avoid drafts, vents or fans.

Light: Moderate to bright, indirect indoor light.

Water: Keep soil moist to dry, allow soil around roots to fry out.

Water from the bottom with room temperature water by placing the pot in water and allow the plant to absorb the water for a maximum of 30 minutes.
